Siya Kolisi's story, as told in his autobiography Rise, is one of extraordinary courage, resilience and commitment. These values lie at the heart of both his leadership and the spirit we nurture at Stanford Lake College. From humble beginnings in Zwide to captaining the Springboks to Rugby World Cup glory, Kolisi's journey embodies what it truly means to rise above circumstance and lead with purpose.

Growing up in a township faced with poverty and hardship, he learned early that courage is not the absence of fear but the ability to stand firm despite it. Kolisi's 100th cap for the Springboks stands as a celebration of this incredible journey, a milestone of excellence built on courage and commitment. Yet beyond the victories and accolades, his legacy lies in how he leads: with humility, faith and an authentic desire to uplift others. His story reminds us that leadership is not defined by titles but by character and compassion.

At Stanford, we celebrate leaders like Siya Kolisi who inspire us to rise, to lead with heart and to live out our values every day, no matter the field we stand on.

Georgina Smit Appointed CEO of Green Building Council South Africa


The Green Building Council South Africa (GBCSA) has announced Georgina Smit as its next Chief Executive Officer, effective May 2026.


