This week, Grant Norton (our Deputy Headmaster Academics), hosted an assembly with an academic focus. As with so much in our school, it was wonderful to pause and acknowledge the achievements of so many of our pupils. The school also heard from our top academics about how they achieved success. The tried and tested techniques were listed: plan properly, prepare for assessments and assignments and not leaving academics to chance were points reiterated by all who spoke. The importance of making good use of classroom contact time, doing prep properly and creating a balance between academics, social time and extra-murals was also reinforced. Mr Norton added that pupils needed to take responsibility for their performance and be accountable for the quality of work produced. Another matter raised by Mr Norton was that of extra lessons. An extra lesson is not a replacement for the lesson at school but should serve to assist, support and reinforce when other avenues have been exhausted. Some of our pupils think that attending a few extra lessons will solve all problems and

this is not the case. Before seeking out a tutor, please remember that we offer an extra lesson programme led by several staff members in the afternoons as well as Academic Assist - a pupil-led initiative run by Rachel Thompson (Head of the Academic Committee). She too spoke in assembly about that programme. Finally, we celebrated our success in the Tritech Science Competition. We also had the pleasure of awarding Academic Colours to Lulu Cooper and acknowledged the pupils who achieved at the highest levels in the Grade 11 IeBT examinations and the Junior Afrikaans Olympiad. Next week we host our first parents meet teachers meeting. This is an important opportunity for parents to gain some insight into the academic program and their child's progress. I urge you to attend.
