TRAIL BADGERS 2025 RECAP

The Trail Badgers wrapped up the year on a high note with the Makgobaskloof Plunge Half Marathon.

The programme officially started at the end of Term 2 with a clear goal: to introduce students not only to trail running, but also to longer-distance running in general. Our main aim was to help students realise their own potential — to show them that with steady training and the right mindset, they could achieve far more than they expected.

We wanted to move beyond short cross-country sprints and help runners gradually build the endurance needed to complete a half marathon (21.1km) by the end of the year. We are proud to say the season was a success!

Our first big outing was the Wolkberg Trail Run, where every member of the group completed their longest run ever. A huge congratulations to Maropeng Kekana and Kaelo Manake, who both pushed themselves all the way to finish the marathon distance — a truly impressive achievement.

Throughout the season, we didn't only focus on trail running, but also included road running to help balance training and build strength and stamina. Regular club runs in the forests and on the roads around the school helped prepare the group for a busy race calendar.

The Trail Badgers went on to compete in several events, including the Iron Crown Trail Run, the Nedbank Spring Opener, and finally the Makgobaskloof Plunge.

A special mention must go to Mika Jones, who had an outstanding season with podium finishes in her Junior Women category at three events:

2nd place - Iron Crown Trail Run (10km)

3rd place – Nedbank Spring Opener (10km)

2nd place – Makgobaskloof Plunge Half Marathon (21.1km)

Another highlight was Mia Drake, who proudly completed her first-ever half marathon at the Plunge — a huge personal milestone.

Looking ahead, 2026 is set to be an even bigger year. Our highlight for next year will be travelling to Underberg to compete in the Drakensberg Rock Jumper 25km. This challenging route includes 805m of elevation gain and takes runners through the stunning foothills of the southern Drakensberg.



Exchange Chronicles Episode Four

CHILE

Exchange in Santiago, Chile

Before coming to Chile, I had no idea what to expect from living in a country with a completely different language and culture. What I imagined turned out to be the complete opposite of what Chile is actually like. From the moment I arrived—after 20 hours of travelling—I was greeted with a warm welcome from my exchange family, which instantly made me feel at home. Starting school soon after, I quickly realised how friendly and open everyone is here.

The school that Holly and I are attending is a British school, so the language barrier hasn't been too difficult to manage. I've made some amazing friends here who already feel like people I've known for far longer than just a month. The teachers are incredibly supportive and have made me feel comfortable and included from the start. Another highlight is the food! The food in Chile is so diverse and absolutely delicious! I've tried many traditional Chilean dishes such as empanadas, mote con huesillo, completos, and sopaipillas, along with food from Venezuela and Colombia. The architecture is stunning — since Chile was once a Spanish colony, there are many beautiful old buildings like the Iglesia de San Francisco, a church that's over 407 years old.

Life in Chile has also come with some new and unexpected experiences. I even experienced an earthquake at school, which is quite common here, though most are very small. In the afternoons, we've started playing volleyball, and recently we played in one of the teams in the interhouse volleyball tournament. We also took part in a service project to support an underprivileged preschool in a rural area of Chile. It was so much fun playing with the children and answering all their curious questions about my hair!


Although the beginning was a little challenging, I'm so glad I came to such a culturally rich country. The people are incredibly kind and welcoming, which has made the experience even more meaningful. The challenges and differences have helped me grow as a person and realize just how big and diverse the world is. Sometimes we tend to get so stuck in our own world that we forget that.

I'm incredibly grateful for this opportunity and would encourage anyone considering an exchange to step outside their comfort zone.








Farewell to Tiaan Fullard
