## INDEPENDENT ATHLETICS

This past Wednesday the whole of Stanford Lake College travelled to Peter Mokaba Stadium in Polokwane, to defend their ten year winning streak at the annual Independent Schools Athletics meeting. As always, there was much excitement around this event, especially as this year we returned to the Stadium after 5 years of schools hosting on their own tracks.

It was a very hot and challenging day for the athletes, with many of them having to do two or more events at the same time due to challenges with the programme. However, all of them put everything that they had into their events, with the majority of them walking away with medals.

Our Team Managers, Miss Hamer and Mr Laureless- Whttington, did an excellent job of making sure that every single event was attended by athletes, and the Stanford Team very quickly started to build a significant lead, which increased as the day went on.

As they did at Interhouse Athletics, some of our top athletes managed to break and set new school records at Independent Schools: Fia Niemann set a new G/19 100m record of 12.75. Rendani Murulana set a new B/17 110mH record of 15.59. Thato Thobejane set a new B/19 400mH record of 59.65, and Lwandile Nkuna set two new records for G/17 100m and 200m, with times of 13.03 and 28.22 respectively.

Needless to say with performances like these, the Stanford Badgers returned home victorious yet again, winning Independent Schools Athletics for the eleventh year in a row.
