SA HARVEST



We recently caught up with alumnus, Ali Conn (Class of 2007. Pictured back row, second from the left), who has been approached by Gidon Novick, founder of Kulula.com, Discovery Vitality and ex-CEO of Comair, to run the Western Cape's faction of his new national non-profit, SA Harvest.

Ali started his career by studying psychology at Rhodes University, and then went on to find his way into TV production. Since then he has had the opportunity to work on well-known television productions such as the X Factor UK, Britain's Got Talent and Top Gear. He has also toured with big stars such as The Rolling Stones, Ellie Goulding, Ed Sheeran, Rudimental, Stephen Fry and Of Monsters & Men. After that he spent three years with Qatar's leading production

house, producing documentaries for National Geographic and Animal Planet. He then returned to Cape Town and has managed all local productions for Red Bull, Puma, Big Concerts & Afropunk, and produced videos for Antonio Banderas, Cristiano Ronaldo and Travis Pastrana in the last two years before he was approached by Gidon.

SA Harvest is a non-profit organisation that is working with the local government and food organisations to completely rethink the country's national food system. The project aims to create equal access to nutrition and eliminate waste in the food chain. SA Harvest is taking the lead in the national coordination of what type of food is donated as well as what food is actually being rescued from being needlessly thrown out. Since the start of lockdown, SA Harvest has rescued enough food to hand out relief of 2,4 million meals to the most vulnerable. However, their aim is much larger than that - as such SA Harvest has expanded operations over the past five months and currently has bases in Johannesburg, Cape Town and Durban - with microsites operational in Port Elizabeth, Nelspruit and Bloemfontein. They have dedicated warehouse space, refrigeration and their own fleet of refrigerated trucks to deliver and collect food where needed. SA Harvest's efforts are able to sustainably grow with trustworthy, effective and devoted national partners. Their team is led by a strong board of reputable members:

- CEO Alan Browde (businessman & son of Julian Browde)
- Director Ronni Kahn (intl. businesswoman & founder of Oz Harvest)

- Gauteng Director Ozzy Nel (manager of Jamie Oliver's restaurants in SA)
- Western Cape Director Ali Conn (Producer)



How can you help?

SA Harvest is looking for links and connections to farmers as well as food retail and wholesale chains that might have food going to waste that they can rescue to help feed the vulnerable. They are also actively searching for interested volunteers willing to assist and offer their skills. The organisation is planning to expand and produce frozen meals and are also on the lookout for more kitchen space in Cape Town or Johannesburg to start this. SA Harvest is a fully registered NPO and provides tax exemption through section 18A certification.

THE OLIFANTS BACKPACKING TRAIL

A group of Old Stanfordians, including Ryan Hyde (Class of 2008), Danielle Hyde (née Souchon, Class of 2008), Leon Joubert (Class of 2008), Lindy Joubert (Class of 2013), Cassandra McGaffin (Class of 2013) and Lori Hyde (Class of 2012), recently embarked on the adventurous Olifants Backpacking Trail. They loved every second of this experience on the Trail which stretched over 4 days and 3 nights in the Kruger National Park. A total distance of 36km, along the banks of the Olifants River was covered, often being rerouted due to hippos spotted on the main route. They had to endure carrying their own tents, equipment, food and dig for water. The top highlights of the trip was walking into a leopard kill and they were beyond fortunate to have experienced a view of four female lion drinking at the river while the sun was rising one morning.

"There is much beauty that the terrain has to offer, something that simply can't be experienced in a vehicle. We got to appreciate the smaller things such as the bird life, trees, the fresh smell of the bush after the rains, tracks and signs, animal behaviour, falling asleep to lions roaring and the most incredible sunrise and sunsets.
