## STANFORD CROWNED INDEPENDENT SCHOOL CHAMPS ONCE AGAIN

On Wednesday this week our school Athletics Team finally took to the field, after a year's absence from inter-schools' competition, to take part in the 2022 Independent Schools' Athletics. After being cancelled in 2021 and delayed due to weather last week, the athletes were itching to show off their skill. This was also the first time that the event has been held on the school's track, and the Grounds Staff and Sports Staff did a fantastic job in preparing a top class event and facilities. Stanford Lake College dominated the event from the get go, taking numerous wins and podium finishes throughout the day. 




The D6 Connect is an app created to keep parents, guardians, pupils and staff updated of any important information regarding the school such as important notices, events, updated calendar etc
