An important offering at Stanford is our Clubs and Societies programme. We see it as a wonderful opportunity for our pupils to expand their interests, learn new skills and interact with a different group of pupils. While many of the clubs and societies on offer are aimed at creating opportunities for recreation, a number of the clubs also expose our pupils to problem solving, teamwork and the acquisition of important life skills. The Robotics Club, for instance, is working through an externally facilitated syllabus that introduces basic coding and programming skills, along with important design and technology concepts. Debating and the Speakers' Societies offer pupils the opportunity to develop their oratory skills along with working on research and speechcraft. The Round Square Society is working towards ensuring that our Round Square commitments and activities remain at the heart of all that we do; while Read with Me offers our pupils an opportunity to be involved in community engagement. Our pupils travel to Glenshiel School and interact with the junior pupils through reading. The Movie Club, Board Games and the new Meet, Chat, Pray Society offer opportunities for relaxation and discussion and spiritual engagement. There is something for the outdoor and adventure enthusiasts through the Fly-tying

and Adventure societies. For those with the environment at heart, the Environmental Society is working on introducing a comprehensive recycling and waste management programme across the campus. Choir, Ballet and Dance and Djembes are further cultural opportunities made available to pupils. Added to the skills learned within the societies, we are fostering the need for commitment and sound organisational skills. Our clubs and societies are an example of the value add of our school. So much is out there for our pupils... so many opportunities for them to grow and learn. This is an offering of education beyond the curriculum. Antone Chekhov, the Russian playwright said: "Wisdom.... comes not from age, but from education and learning." May that hold true for the pupils in our care.

Our athletes had to work exceptionally hard against some good competition from PEPPS and Curro Heuwelkruin in particular. Zayd Moosa broke the U/17 Boys shot-put record, and Isabella Brett set a new girls U/15 Discus record. Nanaki Kgopong put together an amazing performance on the day, scoring more points than any other athlete, earning her the trophy of Senior Victrix Ludorum.

Despite these great individual performances, it was a real team effort, especially in the relays where SLC scored 86 points ahead of Curro's 80 points. In the end, we won the event for the 9th year in a row (and 15th year in total) scoring 733 total points. Well done Stanfordians - pupils and coaches.
