We have had an icy week at the College and I am sure you have seen some of the beautiful photographs on social media. We truly do live, learn and work in a stunning environment. We have had a busy academic and sport week and the pupils have shown tremendous commitment to all spheres of school life.

Earlier in the week, we shifted our focus to wellness—an important part of our approach at Stanford. In line with the new device policy, our Wellness Champions led a session on cellphone use and the effects of too much screen time, especially on social media. The lesson encouraged pupils to think honestly about their digital habits and consider ways to build a healthier relationship with their phones.

During the discussion, they explored questions such as:

- 1. What are we using our phones for?
- 2. What are the positives of having a phone?
- 3. What are the negatives?
- 4. How do we feel when we don't have our phones on us?
- 5. And importantly—do we consider doom scrolling (mindless, repetitive scrolling) a bad habit?



Pupils were introduced to the habit cycle - trigger, action, reward and how cellphone usage can become an automatic behaviour. We discussed possible triggers such as boredom, anxiety, or simply having the phone within reach. They explored how changing the trigger - turning off notifications, deleting certain apps during study times, or physically placing the phone in another room can help break this cycle.

By raising awareness and encouraging practical changes, we hope to empower pupils to take greater control over their screen habits.

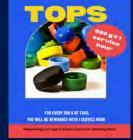

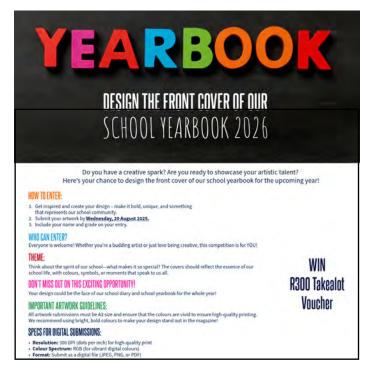
