

STANFORD LAKE COLLEGE ACADEMIC FAQs

Is Afrikaans compulsory for foreign students?

If a pupil has moved to South Africa after their Grade 7 year, they are exempt from doing Afrikaans. When they reach their Grade 10 year, they are then required to take 4 choice subjects.

What were your 2022 Matric results?

92% of the Class of 2022 achieved a Bachelor Degree pass, enabling them to pursue further study at tertiary institutions. The class of 2022 achieved 103 A's, with our Dux learner achieving 9 A's. Two pupils earned 6 distinctions, 6 pupils earned 5 distinctions and 5 pupils earned 4 distinctions. Our pupils achieved an average of 1.63 distinctions per candidate. Our Dux learner also obtained 100% for Mathematics and was placed in the top 1% in the country for Maths, English Home Language, Life Sciences and Physical Sciences. She was also placed on the IEB's "Outstanding Achievers" list which recognises those students who came in the top 5% in six or more of their subjects plus a distinction in Life Orientation. Four other pupils were also placed in the top 1% in various subjects.

Do you offer extra academic support to pupils in need?

Pupils identified as needing extra support are required to sit an external assessment. The result of which needs to be shared with the Independent Examination Board (IEB). After this, the extra time, reading assistance of scribe assistance can be implemented. Our Matric pupils also offer an Academic Assist programme that helps pupils in younger grades. Teachers are available after hours to offer extra support.

BOARDING

Our boarding houses are a place for social development, providing endless opportunities for self-discovery, individual growth and making friends for life. The secure and structured environment is designed to recognise and nurture individuals for who they are. The boarding houses are modern and comfortable and every effort is made to ensure that students are happy and productive.

Each boarding house is supervised by a senior house parent who lives in an attached residence.

Approximately 70% of students are boarders, of whom nearly
one third are termly boarders. The rest are weekly boarders
who go home every weekend.

Are there additional costs for termly boarders?

Pupils wishing to stay in the boarding houses over the weekend pay an additional cost of R352.00 per weekend via the ALLXS system. Weekly boarders must make prior arrangements for staying in.

BOARDING FAQs

What activities are available to termly boarders on the weekends?

Duty staff schedule weekend activities such as going for a hike, rafting on the lake, attending a local market or visiting Mall of the North in Polokwane, under the supervision of a staff member and with the proviso that duty staff are able to accommodate numbers.

Do the boarding houses have a laundry service?

There is a laundry service and schedules are set for each boarding house. Weekly boarders are asked to take their bedding home to be washed at the weekends. Each child must have their own laundry bag and sock bag for washing. All clothing items are to be clearly marked.

What are the bathroom facilities and their configuration? Each boarding house differs slightly, but it works out to about four pupils per shower. Each toilet and shower is contained in it's own cubicle.

How many pupils share a room?

The largest room size in any of the boarding houses is a four-person room. Many are two-person.

Are pupils allowed bar fridges in their rooms or is there access to a fridge?

All boarding houses have a communal lounge with a fridge, microwave and kettle. Only Grade 11 and 12 pupils are allowed a bar fridge in their rooms.

TRANSPORT

Stanford Lake College offers the following transport for students at an additional cost and only by prior arrangement:

STANFORD LAKE COLLEGE TO TZANEEN

We have a daily bus that runs collects Day Scholars in the morning in Tzaneen and drops them off in the afternoon again (Monday to Friday)

STANFORD LAKE COLLEGE TO POLOKWANE

We have a bus that collects our weekly boarders in Polokwane on a Monday morning and drops them off again on a Friday afternoon.

STANFORD LAKE COLLEGE TO O.R TAMBO / MIDRAND

At the beginning and end of each term, we run a bus between SLC and O.R Tambo International Airport and Midrand for those needing to catch a flight home or for those residing in the Gauteng area.





OUTDOOR EDUCATION

Adventure is a cornerstone of education at Stanford Lake College. Adventure racing, mountain biking, kayaking, wall climbing, abseiling, rafting, orienteering, archery and wilderness expeditions form part of our outdoor curriculum, teaching skills that push beyond the restrictions of the classroom.

We take the safety of our students extremely seriously and all adventure classes, trips and expeditions are conducted by professionally trained expedition leaders.

Pupils in Grade 8 and 9 spend one full day per fortnight (three lessons per week) attending Outdoor Education lessons at the Dream an' Do Centre and enjoy two different expeditions each year.

How many terms do you have? We have four terms, with two mid-term breaks that occur during Terms 1 and 3. What sort of security is provided on the premises?	Do you offer an Open Day? We host an Open Weekend every year during the month of March for prospective Grade 6s and 7s and their parents. It's a fun-filled 24 hours with many activities. We also offer private tours to ap- plicants from other grades by prior arrangement.	Is there a sick bay and trained nurse on site? Our newly built sanatorium will be ready in April 2023. We have a qualified school nurse who lives on the property.
There is a strict daily schedule for students in boarding, our en- tire premises is electrically fenced and there is only one main entrance via the security gate that is manned 24/7. There is a keypad lock at the main entrance to all the boarding houses and we have 24-hour CCTV in operation. Driver licences are scanned upon entry and there is a strict driver's sign-out policy for all pu- pils.	Does the school have an anti-bullying programme? Bullying at Stanford Lake College is taken very seriously and is a Level 3 Transgression in the Student Code of Conduct. All students, staff and parents have a right to report any forms of bullying.	
What other additional costs may a parent incur, other than school fees? The tuition fees include print stationery, Trek fees, Olympiads and IEB examination fees. The only additional cost/fee that will be charged to the school fee account is textbook charges (the reason for this being that the cost of books varies from subject to subject). Books returned by pupils at the end of the year are credited against the textbook charges for the new year. All optional extras will be driven through the online platform, ALLXS, including bus fares, uniform, weekend meals, sports and cultural tours, courses, etc.	Does the Dining Hall have a general plan for the week?
